Advent New Beginnings: Mercy and Conversion

Advent starts the new Liturgical Year and can be seen as another opportunity to spiritually begin anew. Holy Mother Church knows how many times we need to start again, because we are all sinners making a pilgrim journey that hopefully will bring us to Christ in His Kingdom. Therefore, there are particular themes in the Liturgy throughout Advent: a spirit of waiting, of conversion and joyful hope. These liturgical themes should inspire what we do within our families during Advent.

The Year of Mercy may have ended at the end of 2016, but truthfully, it was just a beginning. The attitude of conversion within the heart of a disciple should continue to grow every day. The parable of the Loving Father to his Prodigal Son was used often during the Year of Mercy as an example of a spirit of conversion, which also applies to beginning again in Advent. St. Josemaría Escrivá sums up this Advent theme of conversion and mercy:

"Human life is in some way

a constant returning to our Father's house. We return through contrition, through the conversion of heart which means a desire to change, a firm decision to improve our life and which, therefore, is expressed in sacrifice and self-giving. We return to our Father's house by means of that sacrament of pardon in which, by confessing our sins, we put on Jesus Christ again and become his brothers, members of God's family.

God is waiting for us, like the father in the parable, with open arms, even though we don't deserve it. It doesn't matter how great our debt is. Just like the prodigal son, all we have to do is open our heart, to be homesick for our Father's house, to wonder at and rejoice in the gift which God makes us of being able to call ourselves his children, of really being his children, even though our response to him has been so poor." (*Christ is Passing By*, no. 64)

My favorite quote from

St. Josemaría continues this thought (emphasis is mine):

"If you should stray from him for any reason, react with the humility that will lead you to begin again and again; **to play the role of the prodigal son every day**, and even repeatedly during the twenty-four hours of the same day..." (*Friends of God*, no. 214).



We are trying to live in Advent what we learned throughout the

Year of Mercy. "Playing the role of the prodigal son" means pushing the restart button not just for this new liturgical year but every day, maybe even multiple times a day. The Advent season helps us hone this daily habit of conversion to keep us working for the ultimate purpose of our lives: eternity in our Father's Heavenly Kingdom.

This Advent—Be the Prodigal Son

Advent means—the coming of Christ at Christmas—and is a time of preparation. The First Sunday of Advent 2017 is December 3.

Practical Ways to Give Ourselves Over to God

Prayer: As St. Teresa of Avila put it, "Prayer is nothing else than being on terms of friendship with God." Talk to your Father in heaven and to your Savior Jesus in quiet. Light your Advent candle and ask Jesus how to serve Him **today**.

Reading Scripture: Read one chapter from the Gospel of Luke each day. Especially read and pray over the Birth of Jesus narrative (Chapter 2) and the Prodigal Son (Chapter 15) as Fr. Smith suggested.

Fasting: Jesus told His disciples in the Gospel of John (Chapter 4:34) that "My food is to do the will of Him who sent me.." Say no to feeding our bodies and yes to feeding our souls!

Repent: Confession is called the "sacrament of conversion" because it makes Sacramentally present Jesus' call to conversion, the first step in returning to the Father from whom one has strayed by sin.

Advent Prayer of Preparation

O my God, Word of the Father, Word made flesh. For the love of us, You assumed a mortal body in order to suffer and be immortalized for us. I wish to prepare for Your coming with the burning desires of the prophets and the just who in the Old Testament sighed after You, the one Savior and Redeemer....O Lord, send Him whom You are going to send... As you have promised, come and deliver us! I want to keep Advent in my soul, that is, a continual longing and waiting for this great Mystery wherein You, O Word, become flesh to show me the abyss of Your redeeming, sanctifying mercy.


