

A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

Due to the declaration from the Governor of the State of Ohio and the Lorain County Board of Health, that Lorain County has reached a Level 3 COVID health risk, the following steps are required in all public places, including Churches, until the risk level is lowered:

Facial masks or coverings shall be worn by individuals. Therefore, I am asking parishioners to wear masks when attending Mass.

There are, however, exceptions to this directive:

1. Individuals with medical conditions, including those with respiratory conditions that restrict breathing, mental health conditions, or disabilities that restrict the wearing of facial coverings are not required to wear a mask.

2. Children under the age of 10 are not required to wear a mask.

3. Officiates of religious services are not required to wear masks, therefore priests are exempt. Also, in his press conference, the Governor said Lectors and Eucharistic Ministers, because they must speak in order to fulfill their ministry, are not required to wear masks. As the Governor said, this order is being interpreted broadly. I ask that Lectors do not wear masks while reading. I however, encourage Eucharistic Ministers to wear a mask while distributing communion.

The difficulty will be enforcing this directive. According to the Diocese, the wearing of masks is "highly recommended", while at the same time Pastors "shouldn't worry if someone chooses not to wear one" and "no one will be excluded for not wearing a mask." Therefore, I ask you to be kind if you come across someone who is not wearing a mask. Do not make the encounter an excuse for someone to turn away from Christ and His Church.





Blessing House has Broken Ground!

"The ground is broken, but the project is not done. We have a building to build, money to raise and we need help from you," said Donna Humphrey, co-founder and director of development for **Blessing House**, a faith-based, nonprofit children's crisis care center in Lorain. "It's not what we've done, it's what you've done. This is part of God's project of hope."

A large crowd gathered on June 26 behind St. Vincent de Paul Parish in Elyria Township for the groundbreaking of the new, 16,700-square-foot facility. The groundbreaking ceremony culminated a three-year, community-driven planning process. Star Builders Inc. is the general contractor. Estimated cost for the construction phase of the project is \$2.5 million. To date, \$1.65 million has been raised for the project.

Guidelines for Attending Public Mass

1. Until further notice, all Catholics in the Diocese of Cleveland remain dispensed from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass. The restart of public Masses means you have the option to attend Mass, but it is not a requirement.

2. Before coming to Mass please take your temperature. If your temperature is 100.4 degrees or higher please stay home. If you feel sick, please stay home.

3. All parishioners should be mindful of social distancing when sitting in pews and in the communion line. Families may sit together, but must maintain social distancing between their family and others throughout the celebration of Mass.

4. The precious blood cannot be offered to the faithful until directed by the Diocese.

5. There will be no offertory procession. Please drop your offertory envelopes in the baskets placed by the doors of the Church.

6. There will be no handshake of peace until further notice.

If you wear a disposable mask during Mass, please do not leave it in the pew. Take it with you or throw it out in the garbage can in the vestibule. *Thank You!*

ONE NATION UNDER GOD -**THROUGH MARY!**

Through a collective dedication or entrustment of a nation to Mary, an act of consecration is meant to be a reminder to the faithful of the Blessed Mother's witness to the Gospel and to ask for her effective intercession before her Son on behalf of those in need. Bishop John Carroll of Baltimore, the first bishop of the United States, promoted devotion to Mary, the Mother of God, and placed the United States under her protection in a pastoral letter of 1792. The twenty-one bishops attending the Sixth Provincial Council of Baltimore in 1846 determined to name the Blessed Virgin Mary, under the title of the Immaculate Conception, as the Patroness of the United States, and Pope Pius IX approved this decision the following year. More recently, the dedication of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, D.C. in 1959 was the opportunity for the bishops to once again consecrate the nation to the Blessed Mother. Several popes have likewise consecrated the world to Mary on various occasions.

A Perfect Act of Contrition – Two Things a Catholic Must Do Pray an Act of Contrition

Being sorry out of love for God has often been described as having a desire to be reunited to God because of who he is-- because of God's perfect love for us, and because of sorrow for having offended God by sin. It means wanting to live in unity with God, and to put aside the sins that stand in the way.

There is no set formula for making an act of contrition, but a common one reads as follows: "My God, I am sorry for my sins with all my heart. In choosing to do wrong and failing to do good. I have sinned against You, whom I should love above all things. I firmly intend, with Your help, to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid whatever leads me to sin."

A Catholic must make a firm commitment to go to confession when that becomes possible.
