



In the Gospel, the Apostles have just returned from their first mission, and The Good Shepherd invites them to come away and rest. Many assume they must be tired and need to relax and put their feet up. I think it is more likely that they are over-the-top enthusiastic because they have experienced the power of God in their mission as they cured people and cast out evil spirits. They are excited...but do they know what this all means? If you read the fuller passage in Mark's gospel, the answer is "No." They really do not get what is happening at all. The farther we move into Mark's gospel, the more clueless the disciples seem to become. Maybe it is because they do not have the space and time to ponder or consider how all this is fitting together. They need to process it all. They need to come away. They need to rest and make room for God.

Jesus invites them to a deserted place, the kind of place in Mark's gospel where ones goes to pray (Mk 1:35); where one also meets face to face both one's temptations and divine assistance (Mk 1:12-13). Perhaps the disciples were in danger of becoming a bit too enamored of their own abilities to perform wonders. The deserted place will help them to process what has just happened – and maybe to see it is not about them and their experience at all. They are part of a bigger picture in which God has seen the sheep of Israel and had compassion for them, because they have longed for a true shepherd for so long.

The deserted place will help the Apostles more deeply experience the divine compassion that called them into mission and that is the source of all they are able to do. From their ability to receive divine compassion in their own neediness, they become able to be the compassion of God toward others. In one small encounter to another, they will become compassionate people.

It is the same for us. From time to time we need to come away, as the Good Shepherd commands us:

To make room in our lives for God

To see what God would have us see

To begin to understand how we are to pray

To face our temptations

To find divine assistance

To see the compassion of God that surrounds us

To become what we see

To see what we were always meant to be – the compassion of God in our time and place

Come away to be what God would have us be.





"Jesus, Mary and Joseph, I love you very much. I beg you to spare the life of the unborn baby that I have spiritually adopted who is in danger of abortion."



During this Year of Saint Joseph, the Church has made a plenary indulgence available to all the faithful who satisfy the usual conditions (confession, Eucharist, prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father, a spirit of detachment from sin, and the intention to gain the indulgence for one's self or someone in purgatory), as well as perform one of the prescribed works, as follows:

- Meditate for at least 30 minutes on the Lord's Prayer, or take part in a spiritual retreat of at least one day that includes a meditation on St. Joseph
- Following St. Joseph's example, perform a spiritual or corporal work of mercy
- Recite the Holy Rosary with your family or your fiancé
- Entrust your daily activity to the protection of St. Joseph
- Pray through the intercession of St. Joseph that those seeking work can find dignifying work
- Recite the Litany of St. Joseph for Christians who suffer all forms of persecution
- Recite any prayer or act of piety legitimately approved in honor of St. Joseph, in particular on March 19, May 1, on the 19th of any month, and every Wednesday

This gift of a plenary indulgence extends particularly to the elderly, the sick, the dying, and all those who, for legitimate reasons, are unable to leave their homes, if, detached from all sin and with the intention of fulfilling, as soon as possible, the usual conditions, recite an act of piety in honor of St. Joseph, comfort of the sick and patron of a good death, offering with confidence to God the pains and trials of their life.
