



We are almost halfway through the Easter Season, and one might ask, "Why?" Why is it necessary to carry on the celebration of Easter? There are several answers to this question. One answer might be that we continue the celebration with joy and solemnity for the same amount of time as the Lenten season where the focus was on penance, prayer and alms giving. Another reason might be that we extend the celebration to the Feast of Pentecost, the birthday of the Church. However, the most important reason of all is that we are celebrating the opening of the gates of Heaven to all the faithful. These gates had been shut since our first parents sinned. Now, because we can approach God with assurance of His love and know that the sacrifice of His Son, on our behalf, earned for us a place in Heaven, we should continue to celebrate and thank God for His infinite love and mercy. Also, there might be another reason, one that most people are not aware of; and that is God is always willing to balance our faults and failures with His grace and forgiveness.

The Gospel Reading today is from the Gospel of St. John (10:27-30). In this short reading, we have the essence of Christ, the Divine Shepherd, who has laid down His life for His people. Now He stands ready to lead His people into the divine pasture of heaven where we will be safe and "never perish." Is this reason enough to continue our Easter celebration? Absolutely! "Celebrating" doesn't have to be with a great deal of fanfare, music, flowers, or incense. It is a condition of the heart and mind. When meditating on what Jesus has done for us, we should never run out of gratitude, praise, and thanksgiving. This is the kind of celebration that God wants from us. Further, if we are still not convinced, we should think about how Jesus, the Son of God, forgave Peter three times after Peter had denied Jesus three times (See: John 21:15-17). He will do the same for us when we come to Him with a contrite heart. Something to think about (and celebrate) during your prayer time this week!





THE STORY OF OUR LADY OF FATIMA

Between May 13 and October 13, 1917, three Portuguese children—Francisco and Jacinta Marto and their cousin Lucia dos Santos—received apparitions of Our Lady at Cova da Iria near Fatima, a city 110 miles north of Lisbon. Mary asked the children to pray the rosary for world peace, for the end of World War I, for sinners, and for the conversion of Russia.
